A quick way for deciding whether a book is "just right" for your child is to try the "five finger rule": Have your child try reading the first two or three pages. If s/he knows most or all of the words, the book is most likely "just right". If s/he comes across five or more difficult words, enjoy the book together by reading it aloud.
