THE WOODSTOWN-PILESGOVE COMMUNITY

Located in the southwest corner of New Jersey in rural Salem County, Woodstown Borough and Pilesgrove Township are communities within an hour's drive of Wilmington, DE, Philadelphia, PA, and the Jersey Shore.

While Pilesgrove Township is defined by its farmland and spacious neighborhoods, Woodstown is a tree-lined community with a small town atmosphere. The area provides numerous places of worship and recreation including a golf course, public library, public park, and much more.

OUR SCHOOLS

The Woodstown-Pilesgrove School District is comprised of 1,600 students from prek - grade 12. Woodstown High School serves students from Woodstown, Pilesgrove, Alloway Township, Upper Pittsgrove Township and Oldmans Township. WHS houses a Communications Academy as well as a Finance and Business Management Academy which draws students from all over the county.

Students in the high school are scheduled for seven periods each day, not including lunch. The high school hours are from 7:35-2:35, and classes are 47 minutes in length. Because we are a small school, students sometimes encounter conflicts in their schedules which preclude them from taking their preferred classes including world language.

WHS also offers a variety of extra-curricular activities encompassing academics, the arts, service organizations, agriculture, athletics and much more through our 40 clubs and 20 sports teams.

ACADEMIC OFFERINGS

- WHS offers AP, honors, and academic level classes in English, social studies, math and science. Accelerated levels are also available in English and math.
- Students can choose to take up to four years of Spanish as their world language.
- WHS offers a variety of business, computer science, art, music, technical and special education classes to prepare our students for the future.
- WHS houses the county's Communications Academy and Finance & Business Management Academy for those interested in pursuing those specialized fields of study.
- WHS offers a nationally recognized, CASE-endorsed Agricultural Science program.
- Students can participate in the Salem County Vocational and Technical School programs on a full- or shared-time basis.
- Eligible seniors can participate in Jump Start through Salem Community College and earn high school and college credits concurrently.
- The High School Options Program is available to 10th-12th grade students through Salem Community College and Rowan College of South Jersey.
- Students can earn college credit for their high school classes through articulation agreements with Salem Community College, Rowan College of SJ, SUNY Cobleskill, Delaware Valley Univ. and Rutgers Univ. called CAP (College Acceleration Program)

Determining Class Rank

Students' numerical grade are used in calculating class rank
Class rank calculation: (for each course) numerical grade x weighting factor x #
of credits. Add the total quality points earned for each course and divide the
cumulative total by the number of credits attempted. The resulting numerical
average is used to determine class rank.

Unweighted & Weighted GPA

Unweighted GPA is out of a 4.0 scale

Weighted GPA Calculation:

Weight scale based on multiplying our course weights by a normal 4.0 GPA scale Weighted Points = (Course Credits)* (Weight associated with final grade earned) Weighted GPA = (Total Weighted Points) / (Total Credits Attempted)

Due to the fact that certain courses are only available to the upper grade levels and that students can follow different course progressions during their 4 years in high school, the maximum weighted GPA changes based on what possible courses a student could have taken by the end of a given year.
